Changes to the Vet Gateway website – New Location of Instructions and Communications

Purpose

- 1. To provide information on how to find content that has been migrated from the Vet Gateway website to the Improve International AHP website, specifically:
- 2. To inform all Approved Tuberculin Testers (ATTs) how to locate the ATT Instructions.
- 3. To inform all Food Competent Certifying Officers (FCCOs) and Animal Health Paraprofessionals (AHPs) how to locate the APHA Briefing Notes and Newsletters.

Location of ATT Instructions

4. To access the ATT instructions, open the Improve International AHP website and click on Instructions and Notifications. You will be presented with four options to enable you to view the Instructions, Newsletters, the AHP Briefing Notes or the FCCO Briefing Notes.

5. To locate the ATT instructions, click on the **Instructions** link. Click on the **Approved Tuberculin Testers** link and you will be presented with an option to view the latest updates or the documents at the top of the screen. Click on **Approved Tuberculin Testers documents** and it will display all the documents for that work area.

6. To locate the Newsletters, AHP Briefing Notes or FCCO Briefing Notes open the Improve International AHP website and click on Instructions and Notifications and then click on the relevant option.
